The University of Victoria (UVic) is one of Canada's leading universities and has been ranked in the top 1% of universities in the world by Times Higher Education (UK). UVic has developed innovative programs in interdisciplinary research, in its professional schools, in co-operative education, distance education, and international skills development. The University is known for quality teaching, excellence in research, and service to the community. The University of Victoria has linkages with 120 institutions in 27 different countries.

The university campus has educational facilities, such as libraries, computer laboratories and classrooms, as well as recreational facilities, housing and food services, a movie theatre, a radio station, a bookstore and campus shop, pubs, and a student center. The campus can be accessed by roads, bike paths, sidewalks, and trails that wind through the gardens and forested campus property.

The English Language Centre works in cooperation with academic departments at the University to support their efforts at internationalization and programming for international students. ELC also offers a variety of programs and trainings intended for instructors and educational leaders.







#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

# Professional Development Certificate in Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL) - Customized

The Professional Development Certificate developed for international educators of English provides an immersive three-week program on campus at the University of Victoria. As a non-credit professional development program, this program offers a stimulating, interactive teaching and learning environment in which international teachers will build a professional network, develop their ability to communicate and teach more effectively in English in six skill areas: listening, speaking, reading, writing, viewing (e.g. interpreting images, movies, graphics, etc.) and representing.

In addition to enhancing participants' general English skills through the use of English as the language of instruction, this program provides a strong professional development focus. Participants will learn a variety of teaching methodologies, curriculum planning strategies, and communicative—experiential classroom techniques which will enable them to plan, design, and develop effective English as a foreign language (EFL) lessons to apply in their classrooms in their own educational environment.

Successful completion of this three-week, face-to-face program culminates in a Professional Development Certificate in Teaching English as a Foreign Language.





# **LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

Participants in this program will develop their skills and knowledge in teaching English to English Language Learners (ELL) with a particular focus on:

- enhancing their ability to provide effective and efficient instruction to English Language Learners in a K – 12 system
- improving their skills in communicative/experiential\* classroom instruction
- reviewing key principles of second language instruction and acquisition, including methodologies, assessment and evaluation strategies, and curriculum development
- participating in a stimulating, interactive professional development experience
- acquiring language which will enable them to more readily communicate with colleagues in a K-12 system
- introducing current research and trends in the area of primary and secondary education
- networking with other educators
- reflecting on their own professional practices

\* Communicative/experiential learning is an approach which focuses on the purposeful use of language to perform real-life tasks through listening, speaking, reading, viewing, and writing while being aware of what is culturally, linguistically, and age appropriate.

# **PROGRAM SCHEDULE**

The program will be offered at the University of Victoria campus as follows:

#### Over three weeks, the core program consists of:

#### Formal classroom instruction: Approximately 60 hours

Participating international teachers will have approximately twenty (20) hours per week of formal classroom instruction on current and effective methodologies, approaches, principles and techniques for teaching English language skills.

The classroom instruction will enhance specific skill areas and introduce teachers to current research, trends, and practical take-away teaching materials, strategies, and techniques. This knowledge can be used for immediate application in their home teaching context or act as complementary knowledge for pre-service teachers seeking to become a classroom teacher of English.

#### Other professional and extra-curricular activities such as:

#### > Special workshops facilitated by scholars and/or experienced instructors

Afternoon professional development sessions will be offered on designated days. Workshops will focus on various subjects such as engaging learners, drama and music in the classroom, interactive games, vocabulary enhancement, linguistics, best practices in education, etc. Facilitators will share invaluable information and practical activities based on the latest research and trends in second/foreign language teaching and learning.

#### Micro-teaching seminars/Educational Visit

During the seminars, participants will have an opportunity to apply and practice TEFL teaching techniques in a lesson format. Each participant will present a mini-lesson and participate in constructive feedback discussions to enhance their learning of TEFL skills.

Included in this program may be an educational visit at a local school/UVic classroom or participation in a panel discussion with local educators.

#### Various socio-cultural events

These activities include visits to culturally significant sites such as the Royal British Columbia Museum and the British Columbia Legislative Building. As well as, other social activities, like Coffee Social where participants have opportunities to practice and converse in English.

- > opportunities to engage in professional discussions with other educators; and
- > a safe and respectful immersion context for the enhancement of both language and cultural intelligence.

Opportunities for practice, interaction, feedback, and cross-cultural understanding are purposefully woven throughout the entire program. Teacher input and engagement (participation) is an integral component of this program. Classes are taught by highly experienced English language teachers, facilitators, and trainers in a positive, supportive and respectful teaching environment.

We have allowed for some unstructured time within this intensive program for participants to study or to engage both Canadian and other international educators in authentic communication in an English language environment. Computer labs are available on campus for the completion of classroom assignments and projects.
